As required under the provisions of section 139(1) of the Companies Act, 2013, the company has received a written consent from M/s Shah & Khandelwal to their re-appointment and a certificate, to the effect that their re- appointment, if made, would be in accordance with the new Act and the Rules frame there under and that they satisfy the criteria provided in Section 141 of the Companies Act, 2013.

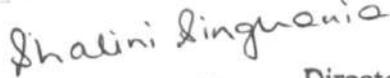

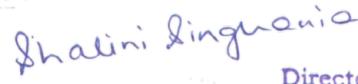

- g. 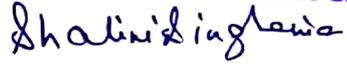

NOTE TO FINANCIAL STATEMENT AS AT 31st MARCH 2025

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.01 Nature of Operation

M/s. 1.02 Basis of preparation of financial statements:

(i) The financial statement of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India (Indian GAAP). However, Schedule II allows Companies to use higher/lower useful lives and residual values if such useful lives and residual values can be technically supported and justification for difference is disclosed in the financial statement.

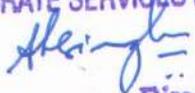

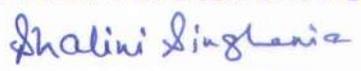
